American with Disability Act (ADA) Considerations and Public Transportation

The designated ADA accessible mass transit is METRO Rail and METRO Bus. The closest METRO train stations for the Nobility meeting point are:

*Foggy Bottom Metro Station - GWU-2301 I Street, NW

(Closest metro station to the Nobility meeting point)

*Federal Triangle Metro Station - 300 12th Street, NW

*Smithsonian Metro Station - 1200 Independence Avenue, SW

Special Needs Individuals may be dropped off and picked up at the following locations, which are also designated as Safe Haven Sites and are ADA accessible:

*Metro Stations – during operational hours only.

*Any FEMS station in the immediate area. Emergency access to these building will be coordinated by HSEMA.

Meeting Point for the Nobility

The Imperial Potentate and his Divan along with the Nobility will assemble at 12 noon at the corner of 22nd & Constitution Avenue NW on the south side of the street in the grassy area.

March Route: Lincoln to MLK Memorial



Marchers will begin lining up on Lincoln Circle NW and proceed South on 23rd St. crossing through the median onto the Southern portion of Independence Ave. They will march to the MLK Memorial which will serve as the dispersal point. Marchers will be routed to DC Metro locations including Farragut West and North, Federal Triangle, and Smithsonian. Anyone, not marching will need to exit the memorial.

METROTRAIL

Each passenger needs a SmartTrip® farecard to enter and exit. The card can be reloaded with value and reused to pay Metrorail and Metrobus fares and parking fees at Metro-operated lots.

Buy a SmartTrip® farecard from a FARE VENDING machine at a Metrorail station. Add value to your card at a FARE VENDING or ADD VALUE machine in Metrorail stations, at select retail locations and on our website. Or buy one at over 200 retail locations or online at wmata.com. Online, you can also check your registered card's value, see where and when you used it last or report it lost or stolen.

Fares are based on when and how far you ride. Station-to-station fares are located on station manager kiosks and FARE VENDING machines. The machines accept cash, credit and debit cards. If you use cash, bring small bills; the machines only provide up to \$10 in change.

If you want one day of unlimited Metrorail rides, save money with a One Day Pass. Buy it from a FARE VENDING machine and load it onto your SmartTrip® card. Up to two children under age five may travel free with a paying customer.

FARES FOR SENIOR/DISABLED CUSTOMERS

Senior citizens 65 and older and people with disabilities may ride for half the regular fare. On Metrorail, use a Senior or WMATA Reduced Fare Program for People with Disabilities (RFP) Photo/SmartTrip® ID card. On Metrobus, use a Senior or RFP SmartTrip®/ID card.

Customers can also present a valid Medicare card and a photo ID and pay the reduced fare in cash. For details about qualifying for the SmartTrip®/ID card and buying senior SmartTrip® cards, visit wmata.com or call 202-637-7000 (TTY 202-962-2033).

Free travel training and orientations on how to use accessible Metrobus and Metrorail services are available to senior citizens and people with disabilities by calling 202-962-2703 (TTY 202-962-2033).

PARKING AT METRO STATIONS

There is a daily fee to park at Metro lots and garages on weekdays. There is no parking fee on weekends and federal holidays. Cash is not accepted, except at metered spaces. All Metro lots and garages accept payment with a SmartTrip® card and most accept major credit cards. Daily parking fees vary by station and are posted at the parking entrance/exit and on our website.

TRAVEL TIPS

To avoid long lines at FARE VENDING machines after a major event, make sure you have roundtrip fare on your SmartTrip® farecard at the start of your trip.

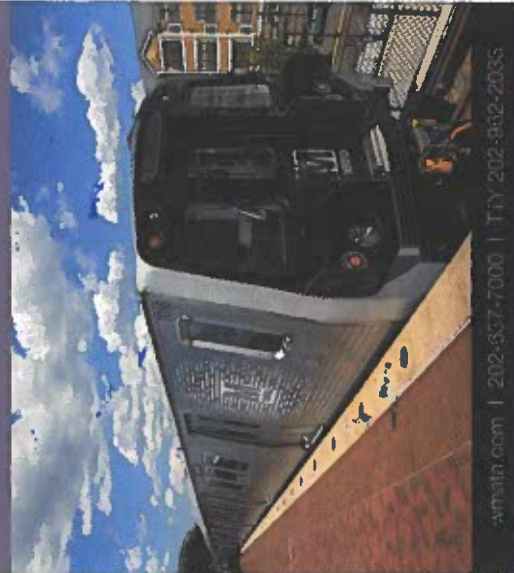
The weekday rush-hour periods — before 9:30 a.m. and between 3 and 7 p.m. — are the most crowded. If possible, plan your trip to avoid those times.
